Children's rights are human rights so we can celebrate them alongside the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.





Year 3



Groundbreaking Greeks and choose the mechanism to make our picture move.


Here we can see the process Samuel has been following.


"Just come" I replied, well not like he had a choice.




