


attend — a letter has been sent home about this but please ask a member of staff if you want to find out more.




This week Year 3 have been making delicious smoothies as part of our learning in **Design Technology**.


Year 5




dimensions and quadrants. If you are unsure of any of these








Year 6




Well done to classes 4RE and 5ST who achieved our school attendance target of 97% and above for the last week!
