The teachers have been really impressed with those children who have completed their creative homework – well done from the Year 3 team!






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Year 4

We created ideas for our moving card and discussed the movement we wanted it to make. On the back card we drew our design. Then we drew the output to show the moving parts. We are looking forward to next week when we will be creating our moving card.





Year 5

Year 5 had the amazing opportunity to visit one of the largest Hindu temples in Europe: **the Shri Venkateswara Temple, more commonly known as the Balaji Temple.** Our guide explained that traditionally Hindu temples are built away from built up areas near nature, where the air is fresher. The belief is that this helps people to erase negative thoughts and focus on being better human beings. The children were very quick to make links between this and Happy Breathing and how they could use it when they feel anger or jealousy. Year 5 also explored the site visiting several of the shrines; each of which is dedicated to a different deity.










Year 6

In science this week, Year 6 have explored the **differences between series and parallel circuits** and compared them to see which is more effective. We found out that the series circuits are more powerful as a higher voltage is being distributed between less lightbulbs, whereas in a parallel circuit, the same voltage is being distributed between a greater number of lightbulbs.

Why is Good Punctuality Important

Being at school every day from 8.30am is important to your child's education. They benefit from well planned sequences of lessons designed to ensure that they make the best possible progress. If they are frequently absent this learning is disrupted and makes it difficult for your child to keep up.

Studies have shown that the children with poor attendance fail to reach their potential and struggle at secondary school and as an adult.

Being on time for school is a life skill that children need to learn as early as possible. Being at school early means that they are ready for the start of lessons and alert and ready to learn. Children who arrive late are often tired and miss the very important explanations at the start of lessons by teachers. This can make children anxious and worried about their learning. It also disrupts other children's learning.
