Hello everyone

Thank you to all the children for their hard work this half term and thank you to you for your support in making sure we had a great start to the new academic year!

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you about the change in attendance legislation this academic year. EACH PARENT/CARER may be at risk of a fine (penalty notice fine) or a prosecution if you take your child out of school during term time for:

- 5 consecutive days of leave in term time
- 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period (one session is a morning OR afternoon)

The first time a penalty notice fine is issued for leave in term time, or irregular attendance, the amount will be £160 per parent/carer, per child when paid within 28 days. The second time a penalty notice fine is issued within 3 years, the amount will be £160 per parent/carer, per child. The third time a penalty notice fine is issued the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court, with fines of up to £2500 per parent/carer issued. Cases found guilty in the Magistrates Court can show on parents'/carers' future DBS certificates as a 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

ALL children are expected to return to school after the ONE WEEK holiday on Monday 4th November from 8.30am and by 8.45am at the latest. Thank you for supporting your child's good attendance and punctuality. We are also looking forward to hosting the next 'time to talk' coffee morning on Monday 4th November from 8.45am to 9.30am in the school dining hall — all parents/carers are welcome to attend.


We took part in a carousel activity, where we orally composed sentences about the main parts of the story. We then recorded our sentences on whiteboards in preparation for writing our narrative.





Year 6


The children generated ideas and created a design for their own buzzer game.
