




The teachers are extremely impressed with the effort and creativity

shown by those who completed their homework. A big well done from the Year 3 team!








Year 4

The children worked in pairs, to identify how to get out of a building safely if there was on fire. They had to find the safest route and closest exit through a window, or door.












Year 5

Magic 10 Raising Class Punctuality Project—3GJ

We are introducing a new initiative this this term to help improve our school punctuality. Class 3GJ will be the first class to take part in **Magic 10 raising class punctuality**. The initiative will **start on Monday 18th November and end on Friday 29th November**. Class 3GJ will have an opportunity to win new games for their class if the whole class are able to successfully improve their class punctuality. This is how The Magic 10 Raising Class Attendance project works:

- Pupils will need to attend school for 10 consecutive days without any absences during the two school weeks.
- Pupils will need to get to bed on time and set their alarm clocks 10 minutes early!
- Pupils will need to ensure they have no late marks for 10 days (unless they have a medical

appointment) and can arrive from 8.30am, but no later then 8.45am.

The table below shows just how much a child with poor punctuality may miss:

If you are	You have been absent
	for an equivalent of
5 minutes late each day	3 days lost
10 minutes late each day	6 ½ days lost
15 minutes late each day	10 days lost
20 minutes late each day	13 days lost
30 minutes late each day	19 days lost
