Year 3

Our topic for science this half term is rocks and soil. As part of our learning, the children took part in a fun exploration around the school grounds to find different types of rocks and soils and discover how they are used. They noticed that brickwork is used in the school walls because it is strong, durable, and keeps water out.

Concrete is used on the playground and under the school because it is very strong and longlasting. In the planters, they found stones that help with drainage by allowing water to flow through the soil.

Year 3 also learned that graphite is used in pencils, slate is used on the roof to help rainwater run off, and chalk is used at playtime because it is soft enough to draw with. It was a fun and exciting way to learn about the materials all around us!







The visit was very useful in helping to consolidate the learning in Science lessons as we saw for ourselves how some plants

reproduce by producing seeds, whilst others - such as strawberries - grow horizontal runners.

We also had a chance to plant tomatoes in Thornton's plot and taste some of the harvest.





Year 6



The Year 6 children have been carrying out their own


research and have created some wonderful observational drawings of these unique animals that inhabit these islands, highlighting how they are adapted to their environment.
